Diversification Centres are non-profit, applied research organizations directed by local producers and industry. The province's four centres conduct applied research and demonstrations on crops, technology and best management practices. Their work advances primary production while supporting sustainable agronomic solutions that benefit local communities and support the growth of agri-food and agri-product processing. Diversification Centres collaborate on projects with several industry groups within the province, collectively extending new agricultural innovations to producers.

Duties:

The fall/winter student provides field operations and post-harvest activities support to applied crop production and agricultural land management research at Diversification Centres.

Activities include assisting in crops harvesting, samples drying, harvested samples cleaning, sub-sampling, samples storage, winter crops seeding, fall data collection (fall soil sampling, winter crops emergence notes, cover crops biomass collection, GHG sampling, etc.), assist in equipment winterization, and data entry.

Qualifications:

- At least 16 years of age at the time of employment, and
- Attending school either full-time or part-time during the current academic year and returning to school in the following semester.
- Proficiency with Microsoft Office applications (Word, Excel, Outlook and PowerPoint).
- Physically capable of working outdoors in various environmental conditions.
- Knowledge of crops production practices in a research setting.
- Strong organizational skills, including the ability to prioritize work and meet time-sensitive deadlines.
- Ability to pay attention to detail and ensure accuracy.
- Ability to work independently with minimal supervision.
- Must be legally entitled to work in Canada.
- Must possess and maintain a valid Manitoba class 5 driver's license.
- Able to work extended hours during peak periods (growing and harvest seasons).
